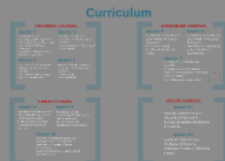

Transfer Credit Guidelines

- Must be completed at an accredited institution (Must be equivalent to a course or part of a course, hours and content)
- General Education & Foundational Science courses
- Within 10 years of completion date
- Grade C or higher
- Nursing courses
- Within 5 years of completion date
- Grade B or higher
- Prerequisite acceptance
- Reviewed by Transfer Credit Committee
- Will not shorten the 2-year program

- 20 - 50% of clinical learning occurs in the simulation lab

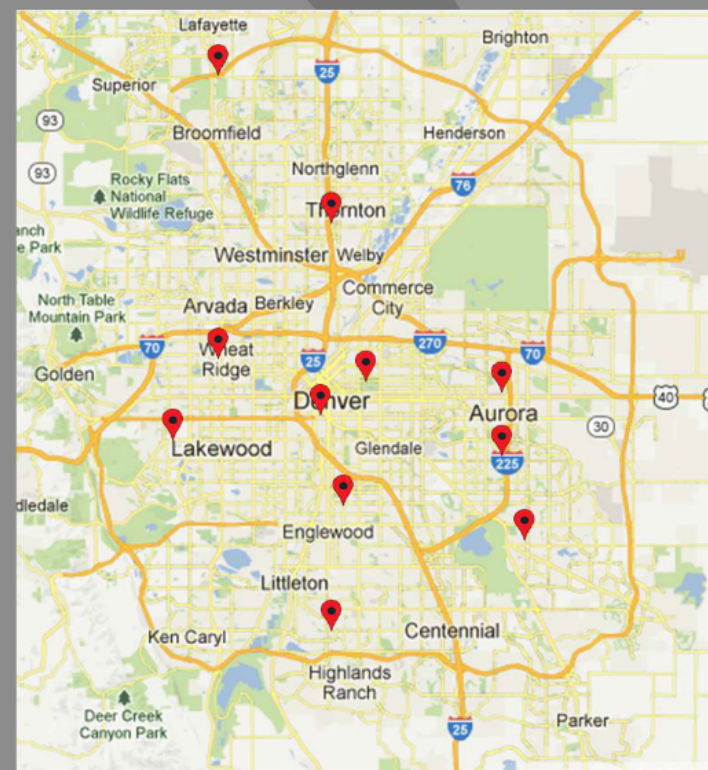

Transfer Credit Guidelines

- Must be completed at an accredited institution
- Must be equivalent to a course at Platt (Credit hours and content)
- General Education & Fundamental Science courses:
 - Within 10 years of completion date
 - Grade C or higher
- Nursing courses:
 - Within 5 years of completion date
 - Grade B or higher

- Evaluated after acceptance
- Reference the Transfer Credit Guide
- Will not shorten the 3-year program

- Sections include: Reading, Science, Math, English
- Multiple choice, online, 209 minute time limit
- ATI TEAS manual available for reference in library
- 3 attempts allowed per year
- Competitively scored
- Scheduled in advance (Monday - Friday)
- To bring day of test:
 - Credit/debit card for \$65.00 test charge
 - Valid photo ID
- Prior to the test, you will respond to a case study essay prompt

Program Overview

The program is a 2-year, full-time, RN program that prepares students for the NCLEX-RN exam and entry into the nursing profession.

- Within 10 years of completion date
- Grade of C or higher
- Nursing courses
- Within 5 years of completion date
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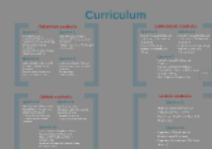
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What Expectations?

The curriculum consists of 10 semesters of coursework, including 4 semesters of nursing courses and 6 semesters of general education courses.

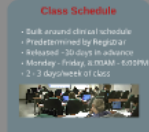
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Clinical Experience
