

- 20 50% of clinical learning occurs in the simulation lab



- Predetermined by Registrar
- Released ~30 days in advance
- Monday Friday, 8:00AM 6:00PM
- 2 3 days/week of class



### **Transfer Credit Guidelines**

- Must be completed at an accredited institution
- Must be equivalent to a course at Platt (Credit hours and content)
- General Education & Fundamental Science courses:
  - Within 10 years of completion date
  - Grade C or higher
- Nursing courses:
  - Within 5 years of completion date
  - Grade B or higher
- Evaluated after acceptance
- Reference the Transfer Credit Guide
- Will not shorten the 3-year program
